Over the past several years our staff have worked hard developing a school culture and teaching and learning practice that gives effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi, through the use of Te Reo Māori, tikanga Māori and te ao Māori. We want all children to be proud and knowledgable about their heritage and cultures, has a strong sense of belonging as well as a thorough understanding of Aotearoa New Zealand history, especially the local history. I know this shines through and is clearly demonstrated at events like Matariki but is also evident in all our classes, every day. We know that when children feel good about themselves, has a strong sense of belonging and connection and know that teachers and whanau have high expectations of them they achieve more. Our connection with local iwi, particularly Te Ākitai Waiohua, whose tupuna name we bear is important to us as is the way our community actively participate in our school through hui, events, celebrations and consultation. ### Junior Production - Letters to Dad


Our **Term 4 school production – "Letters to Dad"** is coming along nicely.
